Vern opened the meeting with prayer which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Vern's treasurer's report indicated a balance in the bank of \$4,916.74 with \$50 plus some change yet to be deposited. He said we have received a refund on the LATA insurance of \$182. The only check that had been written since last month was for miscellaneous items purchased by Wilma.

Don inquired if there were any comments to be made about the last cookout and everyone agreed it was a good one.

JULY GET TOGETHER WITH BARBECUE A SUCCESS


