Attending the board meeting on October 13 were Don Hughes, Jim Snyder, Vern Sullenger, Ted Bock, Amy Hills, John Rothrock, Reed Blair and Wilma Winings

Don called the meeting to order and led in prayer. The Pledge of Allegiance followed.

Vern reported \$5,093.60 in the bank with \$54 and some change on hand to deposit. Contributions at last month's cookout totaled \$79. Expense was \$25 for the meat.

Wilma referred to the March newsletter and the report on the Hendricks Co. Airport Advisory Committee meeting in February. The renaming of the entry road at the airport issue was to be put on the Airport Authority Board agenda in March. Nothing has been heard on that subject since. John will check to see what he can find out about it.

John also mentioned that Rosie Bozell passed away last Saturday. She and Jerry have been members of HCAA for many years.


